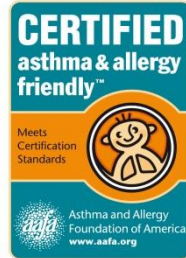




Fellowes AeraMax™ Air Purifiers Receive Asthma & Allergy Friendly Certification



Itasca, IL.(July 23, 2013) The new Fellowes AeraMax™ line of air purifiers have been certified asthma & allergy friendly.™ This certification administered by the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America (AAFA) confirms that the AeraMax air purifiers demonstrate the ability to reduce the total airborne allergen levels in a defined indoor space. The certification is an aid to asthma and allergy sufferers looking for air purification products that truly can help with their condition. The three models in the AeraMax line all have true HEPA filters which safely remove 99.97% of airborne particles as small as 0.3 microns, including pollen, ragweed and other allergens, viruses, germs, dust mites, mold spores and cigarette smoke. All three models feature the AeraSmart™ Sensor, which monitors the air quality and automatically adjusts the fan speed to keep the air purified, and the Aera+™ setting for allergy and cold and flu seasons. The three models differ by the amount of air space they can purify. The AeraMax 100 purifies air in a 100 square foot room. The AeraMax 200 covers 200 square feet of air space, and the 300 offers a maximum reach of 300 square feet. In addition to the asthma & allergy friendly

certification, the AeraMax line is also certified by the Association of Home Appliance Manufacturers (AHAM) and the California Air Resource Board (CARB).
