Alliteration

The repetition of the same initial sound

"Ben bought big bananas in Birmingham"



Allusion

A reference to a famous person, place, or event

"He was lying so much I'm surprised his nose wasn't growing like Pinocchio's"



Hyperbole

An exaggeration that can't be true

"He was as big as a house"



Idiom

CA group of words whose meaning isn't understood from their literal meanings

"They had a change of heart"



Metaphor

A comparison of two unlike things that says one thing is another

"Time is money"



Onomatopoeia

Words whose sounds suggest their meaning

"Splat"



Oxymoron

A phrase whose words contradict each other with opposite meanings

"Tiny elephant"

Simile

A comparison of two unlike things using like or as

"As American as apple pie"



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
